## VICE PRESIDENT AND DEAN, COLLEGE OF VETERINARY MEDICINE

Dr. Jason Johnson serves as Vice President and Dean of LMU's College of Veterinary Medicine. Dr. Johnson earned a BS in Biology from Troy State University, his DVM (Doctor of Veterinary Medicine) degree from Auburn University, and an MS in Biomedical Sciences from Auburn University.

Before coming to LMU as a founding member of the College of Veterinary Medicine, Dr. Johnson served as Assistant Professor of Theriogenology at Ross University –School of Veterinary Medicine and enjoyed a prosperous career in private practice.

Dr. Johnson has extensive professional and teaching experience. Upon graduating from Auburn University with his Doctorate of Veterinary Medicine, he served as large/small animal associate veterinarian at Riverdale Veterinary Hospital from 2003-2004 and large/small animal associate veterinarian at Greene County Veterinary Medical Center from 2004-2006. While pursuing his MS in Biomedical Sciences, Dr. Johnson served as the Resident Theriogenologist at Auburn University. From 2009-2010, he served as owner and operator of Jason W. Johnson Veterinary Reproductive Services in Randolph, Alabama.

Dr. Johnson has been very active in participation on national committees that serve the veterinary community. His service includes membership on: the American Association of Equine Practitioners, 2000-2005; the American Association of Bovine Practitioners, 1999-2006, 2013-present; the Society of Theriogenology, 2001-present; the Alabama Veterinary Medical Association, 2006-present; the American Veterinary Medical Association, 2003-present; the American College of Theriogenologists, 2008-present; and the American Veterinary Epidemiology Society, 2017-present.
